## A BILL

To amend the Export Administration Act of 1979 to extend indefinitely the current provisions governing the export of certain domestically produced crude oil.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF RESTRICTIONS ON OIL EX-**  
4 **PORTS.**

5 Section 7(d) of the Export Administration Act of  
6 1979 (50 U.S.C. App. 2406(d)) is amended by adding at  
7 the end the following new paragraph:

8 “(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 20, or  
9 any other provision of law, this subsection shall remain

1 in effect until expressly repealed. During any period dur-  
2 ing which this subsection is in effect (without regard to  
3 the application of the termination provision in section  
4 20)—

5           “(A) all authorities under this Act may be exer-  
6 cised to the extent necessary to assure compliance  
7 with this subsection; and

8           “(B) the provisions of section 11 shall apply to  
9 violations under this subsection.”.

10 **SEC. 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENT.**

11       Section 20 of the Export Administration Act of 1979  
12 (50 U.S.C. App. 2419) is amended by striking “The” and  
13 inserting “Except as provided in section 7(d)(4), the”.
