Mr. D'AMATO introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

To provide for additional radio broadcasting to Iran by the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Radio Free Iran Act".

5 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

6 Congress makes the following findings:

7 (1) It is the policy of the United States to sup-
8 port the right of the people of Iran to seek, receive,
9 and impart information and ideas through any
10 media, regardless of frontiers, in accordance with ar-

1 title 19 of the Universal Declaration of Human
2 Rights.

3 (2) Consonant with this policy, radio broadcast-
4 ing to Iran may be effective in furthering the open
5 communication of accurate information and ideas
6 about Iran to the people of Iran.

7 (3) Such broadcasting to Iran, operated in a
8 manner not inconsistent with the broad foreign pol-
9 icy of the United States and in accordance with high
10 professional standards, would be in the national in-
11 terest.

12 **SEC. 3. RADIO BROADCASTING TO IRAN.**

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—In order to carry out the objec-
14 tives set forth in section 2, the United States Information
15 Agency shall provide for the open communication of infor-
16 mation and ideas on Iran through the use of radio broad-
17 casting to Iran. Radio broadcasting to Iran under this sec-
18 tion shall serve as a consistently reliable and authoritative
19 source of accurate, objective, and comprehensive news on
20 Iran.

21 (b) REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO BROADCASTING.—
22 (1) Radio broadcasting under subsection (a) shall be pro-
23 vided in accordance with standards that ensure the broad-
24 cast of programs which are objective, accurate, and bal-
25 anced, and which present a variety of views. Such stand-

1 ards shall be established by the board established under
2 section 4.

3 (2) Radio broadcasting under subsection (a) shall be
4 provided in the Farsi language.

5 (c) DESIGNATION OF BROADCASTS.—Any program of
6 United States Government radio broadcasts in the Farsi
7 language under this section shall be designated “Radio
8 Free Iran”.

9 (d) RELATIONSHIP WITH OTHER RADIO SERVICE TO
10 IRAN.—It is the sense of Congress that radio broadcasting
11 under this section supplement and not supplant other
12 radio broadcasting and radio broadcasting services to Iran
13 in the Farsi language that are provided by the United
14 States Government.

15 (e) AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT.—The Director of the
16 United States Information Agency may carry out this sec-
17 tion by means of grants, contracts, and leases and by such
18 other means as the Director determines appropriate. Any
19 grant, contract, or lease under this subsection shall specify
20 that payment thereunder by the Director is subject to the
21 availability of appropriations therefor.

22 (f) ASSISTANCE FROM OTHER GOVERNMENT AGEN-
23 CIES.—The Director may secure on a reimbursable basis
24 from any department or agency of the Federal Govern-
25 ment, with the concurrence of the head of the department

1 or agency, any technical or administrative support or serv-
2 ices (including personnel and property) that the Director
3 may require in order to provide radio broadcasting to Iran
4 under this section. Any reimbursement under this sub-
5 section shall be credited to the appropriation from which
6 the support or services was derived.

7 **SEC. 4. ADVISORY BOARD.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is hereby established an ad-
9 visory board to be known as the Advisory Board for Radio
10 Free Iran (in this section referred to as the “Board”).

11 (b) MEMBERSHIP MATTERS.—(1) The Board shall be
12 composed of eight members of whom—

13 (A) four shall be appointed by the President;

14 (B) two shall be appointed by the President pro
15 tempore of the Senate, upon the recommendation of
16 the majority and minority leaders of the Senate; and

17 (C) two shall be appointed by the Speaker of
18 the House of Representatives, in consultation with
19 the minority leader of the House of Representatives.

20 (2) Members shall be appointed for terms of 4 years.
21 Any vacancy in the Board shall not affect its powers but
22 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
23 ment.

24 (3) The President shall designate one member of the
25 Board to be the Chairman.

1 (c) DUTIES.—The Board shall have the following du-
2 ties:

3 (1) To establish standards for the broadcast of
4 programs under section 3, which standards shall en-
5 sure that such programs are objective, accurate, and
6 balanced, and present a variety of views.

7 (2) To monitor the broadcast of programs
8 under that section in order to ensure that the pro-
9 grams meet the standards so established.

10 (d) COMPENSATION.—(1) Each member of the Board
11 who is not an officer or employee of the Federal Govern-
12 ment shall be compensated at a rate equal to the daily
13 equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay prescribed for
14 level IV of the Executive Schedule under section 5315 of
15 title 5, United States Code, for each day (including travel
16 time) during which such member is engaged in the per-
17 formance of the duties of the Board. All members of the
18 Board who are officers or employees of the United States
19 shall serve without compensation in addition to that re-
20 ceived for their services as officers or employees of the
21 United States.

22 (2) The members of the Board shall be allowed travel
23 expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, at
24 rates authorized for employees of agencies under sub-
25 chapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code,

1 while away from their homes or regular places of business
2 in the performance of services for the Board.

3 (e) PROCUREMENT OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.—
4 The Board may, to the extent it considers necessary to
5 carry out its duties under this section, procure supplies,
6 services, and other personal property, including specialized
7 electronic equipment.

8 **SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

9 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
10 are authorized to be appropriated for the United States
11 Information Agency for fiscal year 1996 such sums as may
12 be necessary for purposes of carrying out this Act, in-
13 cluding the activities of the Board established under sec-
14 tion 4.

15 (b) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Amounts appro-
16 priated under this section shall remain available until
17 expended.

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
