## A BILL

To make the antitrust laws applicable to owners of teams of major league professional baseball players, and to leagues composed of such teams, with respect to selecting the site at which any such team plays its regular season home games.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom of Movement  
5 for Baseball Teams Act of 1997”.

1 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON ANTITRUST IMMUNITY APPLICABLE**  
2 **TO HOME LOCATIONS OF PROFESSIONAL**  
3 **BASEBALL TEAMS.**

4 An owner of all or part of a team of major league  
5 professional baseball players shall not be immune to liabil-  
6 ity under the antitrust laws for entering into, attempting  
7 to enter into, performing, or enforcing a contract that is  
8 made (or attempted to be made) by 2 or more owners of  
9 teams of major league professional baseball players (or 2  
10 or more leagues composed of such teams) and that pro-  
11 vides for 1 or more of such owners (or 1 or more of such  
12 leagues) to determine the location at which a team of  
13 major league professional baseball players plays its regular  
14 season home games.

15 **SEC. 3. DEFINITION.**

16 For purposes of this Act, the term “antitrust laws”  
17 has the meaning given it in subsection (a) of the first sec-  
18 tion of the Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. 12(a)), except that  
19 such term includes section 5 of the Federal Trade Com-  
20 mission Act (15 U.S.C. 45) to the extent such section ap-  
21 plies to unfair methods of competition.
