Mr. MOYNIHAN (for himself and Mr. D'AMATO) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To provide for the relief and payment of an equitable claim
to the estate of Dr. Beatrice Braude of New York, New
York.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PAYMENT OF EQUITABLE CLAIM TO THE ES-**
4 **TATE OF DR. BEATRICE BRAUDE.**

5 (a) PAYMENT.—From funds appropriated to the De-
6 partment of Justice for fiscal year 1997, the Attorney
7 General of the United States shall pay \$200,000 to the
8 estate of Dr. Beatrice Braude of New York, New York
9 as an equitable claim as found by the hearing officer of
10 the Court of Federal Claims pursuant to Congressional

1 reference proceedings under sections 1492 and 2509 of
2 title 28, United States Code, and subsequently stipulated
3 by the Department of Justice, relating to the discharge
4 and disbarment of Dr. Beatrice Braude from Federal em-
5 ployment.

6 (b) FULL SETTLEMENT.—The payment made under
7 subsection (a) shall constitute full settlement of all legal
8 and equitable claims by the estate of Dr. Beatrice Braude
9 of New York, New York, against the United States.

10 (c) NO INFERENCE OF LIABILITY.—Nothing in this
11 section shall be construed as an inference of liability on
12 the part of the United States.

13 (d) ATTORNEY'S FEES.—No part of the amount ap-
14 propriated in this section in excess of 10 percent thereof
15 shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or
16 attorney on account of services rendered in connection
17 with this section, and the same shall be unlawful, any con-
18 tract to the contrary notwithstanding. Violation of the pro-
19 visions of this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by
20 a fine not to exceed \$1,000.
