Mr. REID introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

To require that applications for passports for minors have parental signatures.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Mikey Kale Passport
5 Notification Act of 1997”.

6 **SEC 2. PASSPORTS ISSUED FOR CHILDREN UNDER 16.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1 of title IX of the Act
8 of June 15, 1917 (22 U.S.C. 213) is amended—

9 (1) by striking “Before” and inserting “(a) IN
10 GENERAL.—Before”, and

1 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
2 section:

3 “(b) PASSPORTS ISSUED FOR CHILDREN UNDER
4 16.—

5 “(1) SIGNATURES REQUIRED.—In the case of a
6 child under the age of 16, the written application re-
7 quired as a prerequisite to the issuance of a passport
8 for such child shall be signed by—

9 “(A) both parents of the child if the child
10 lives with both parents;

11 “(B) the parent of the child having pri-
12 mary custody of the child if the child does not
13 live with both parents; or

14 “(C) the surviving parent (or legal guard-
15 ian) of the child, if 1 or both parents are de-
16 ceased.

17 “(2) WAIVER.—The Secretary of State may
18 waive the requirements of paragraph (1)(A) if the
19 Secretary determines that circumstances do not per-
20 mit obtaining the signatures of both parents.”.

21 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
22 this section shall apply to applications for passports filed
23 on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
