Mr. ROCKEFELLER (for himself, Mr. SPECTER, Mr. LOTT, and Mr. DASCHLE) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Recognizing Disabled American Veterans.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR DISABLED**
4 **AMERICAN VETERANS EVENT.**

5 Disabled American Veterans shall be permitted to
6 sponsor a public event on the West Front Lawn of the
7 Capitol on June 16 and 17, 1998, or on such other dates
8 as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
9 Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate
10 may jointly designate, in order announce the donation of

1 147 vans to the Department of Veterans Affairs by Dis-
2 abled American Veterans.

3 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section
5 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-
6 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under
7 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol
8 and the Capitol Police Board.

9 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—Disabled Amer-
10 ican Veterans shall assume full responsibility for all ex-
11 penses and liabilities incident to all activities associated
12 with the event.

13 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

14 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
15 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, Disabled Amer-
16 ican Veterans may erect upon the Capitol Grounds such
17 stage, sound amplification devices, and other related struc-
18 tures and equipment as may be required for the event au-
19 thorized by section 1.

20 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
21 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
22 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
23 quired to carry out the event, including arrangements to
24 limit access to First Street Northwest and First Street
25 Southwest as required for the event.

1 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

2 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
3 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
4 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concern-
5 ing sales, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol
6 Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the
7 Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event authorized by
8 section 1.

9 **SEC. 5. PHOTOGRAPHS.**

10 The event authorized by section 1 may be conducted
11 only after the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Po-
12 lice Board enter into an agreement with Disabled Amer-
13 ican Veterans and the manufacturer of the vans referred
14 to in section 1 that prohibits Disabled American Veterans
15 and such manufacturer from using any photograph taken
16 at the event for a commercial purpose. The agreement
17 shall provide for financial penalties to be imposed if any
18 photograph is used in violation of this section.
