

1 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—Disabled Amer-
2 ican Veterans shall assume full responsibility for all ex-
3 penses and liabilities incident to all activities associated
4 with the event.

5 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

6 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
7 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, Disabled Amer-
8 ican Veterans may erect upon the Capitol Grounds such
9 stage, sound amplification devices, and other related struc-
10 tures and equipment as may be required for the event au-
11 thorized by section 1.

12 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
13 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
14 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
15 quired to carry out the event, including arrangements to
16 limit access to First Street Northwest and First Street
17 Southwest as required for the event.

18 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

19 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
20 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
21 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concern-
22 ing sales, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol
23 Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the
24 Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event authorized by
25 section 1.

1 **SEC. 5. PHOTOGRAPHS.**

2 The event authorized by section 1 may be conducted
3 only after the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Po-
4 lice Board enter into an agreement with Disabled Amer-
5 ican Veterans and the manufacturer of the vans referred
6 to in section 1 that prohibits Disabled American Veterans
7 and such manufacturer from using any photograph taken
8 at the event for a commercial purpose. The agreement
9 shall provide for financial penalties to be imposed if any
10 photograph is used in violation of this section.
