CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the
Million Family March.

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1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF MILLION FAMILY MARCH**
2 **ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

3 Million Family March, Incorporated (in this resolu-
4 tion referred to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to
5 sponsor a public event, the Million Family March, on the
6 Capitol Grounds on October 16, 2000, or on such other
7 date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
8 the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate
9 may jointly designate.

10 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section
12 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-
13 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under
14 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol
15 and the Capitol Police Board.

16 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
17 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
18 incident to all activities associated with the event.

19 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

20 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
21 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, beginning on the
22 day preceding the event authorized by section 1, the spon-
23 sor may erect or place and keep on the Capitol Grounds,
24 until not later than 8:00 p.m. of the day succeeding the
25 event, such stage, sound amplification devices, and other

1 related structures and equipment as may be required for
2 the event.

3 (b) **ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**—The Architect of
4 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
5 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
6 quired to carry out the event.

7 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

8 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
9 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
10 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
11 cerning sales, advertising, displays, and solicitations on
12 the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions applica-
13 ble to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event au-
14 thorized by section 1.

15 **SEC. 5. LIMITATIONS ON REPRESENTATIONS.**

16 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—No person may represent, either
17 directly or indirectly, that this resolution or any activity
18 carried out under this resolution in any way constitutes
19 approval or endorsement by the Federal Government of
20 any person or any product or service.

21 (b) **ENFORCEMENT.**—The Architect of the Capitol
22 and the Capitol Police Board shall enter into an agree-
23 ment with the sponsor, and such other persons partici-
24 pating in the event authorized by section 1 as the Archi-
25 tect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board considers

1 appropriate, under which such persons shall agree to com-
2 ply with the requirements of subsection (a). The agree-
3 ment shall specifically prohibit the use of any photograph
4 taken at the event for a commercial purpose and shall pro-
5 vide for the imposition of financial penalties if any viola-
6 tions of the agreement occur.
