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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 18th annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service.

- 1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
- 2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**  
2 **PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

3 *The National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-*  
4 *iary shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, the eight-*  
5 *eenth annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service, on*  
6 *the Capitol Grounds on May 15, 1999, or on such other*  
7 *date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and*  
8 *the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate*  
9 *may jointly designate, in order to honor the more than 160*  
10 *law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty during*  
11 *1998.*

12 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

13 *(a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section 1*  
14 *shall be free of admission charge to the public and arranged*  
15 *not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions*  
16 *to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the Cap-*  
17 *itol Police Board.*

18 *(b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The National Fra-*  
19 *ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall assume full*  
20 *responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident to all*  
21 *activities associated with the event.*

22 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

23 *(a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the ap-*  
24 *proval of the Architect of the Capitol, the National Frater-*  
25 *nal Order of Police and its auxiliary are authorized to erect*  
26 *upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplification*

1 *devices, and other related structures and equipment, as may*  
2 *be required for the event authorized by section 1.*

3 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

4 *The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforcement*  
5 *of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act of July*  
6 *31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concerning sales,*  
7 *displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds, as well*  
8 *as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol Grounds, with*  
9 *respect to the event authorized by section 1.*

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
