A BILL

To prohibit the Department of State from imposing a charge or fee for providing passport information to the general public.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom of Passport
5 Information Act of 1999”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION AND REQUIREMENT CONCERNING**
2 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE PASSPORT INFOR-**
3 **MATION SERVICES.**

4 For fiscal year 2000 and for each subsequent fiscal
5 year, the Secretary of State shall provide for a United
6 States passport information telephone inquiry service for
7 the general public which shall be available without charge
8 or fee imposed by the Department of State or any other
9 entity under contract to the Department of State.
