2 **DATES FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR**
3 **HIGHER EDUCATION FOR SPOUSES AND**
4 **CHILDREN OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS**
5 **KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.**

6 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 1216(a) of the Omnibus
7 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C.
8 3796d–5(a)) is amended—

9 (1) by striking “May 1, 1992,” and inserting
10 “May 1, 1978,”; and

11 (2) by striking “October 1, 1997,” and insert-
12 ing “October 1, 1978,”.

13 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
14 subsection (a) shall take effect October 1, 1999.
