AN ACT

To provide for the placement at the Lincoln Memorial of a plaque commemorating the speech of Martin Luther King, Jr., known as the “I Have A Dream” speech.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 (2) *RELATION TO COMMEMORATIVE WORKS*
2 *ACT.—The Commemorative Works Act (40 U.S.C.*
3 *1001 et seq.) shall apply to the design and placement*
4 *of the plaque within the area of the Lincoln Memo-*
5 *rial.*

6 (b) *ACCEPTANCE OF CONTRIBUTIONS.—*

7 (1) *IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior*
8 *is authorized to accept and expand contributions to-*
9 *ward the cost of preparing and installing the plaque,*
10 *without further appropriation. Federal funds may be*
11 *used to design, procure, or install the plaque.*
