Mr. DREIER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Fred Forrest.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RETIREMENT CREDIT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Any periods between September
5 18, 1968, and April 1, 1972, during which Fred Forrest
6 of Duarte, California, was on temporary disability leave
7 from active military service as a result of injuries sus-
8 tained in the Vietnam conflict shall be considered periods
9 of military service by him for purposes of determining en-
10 titlement to and the amount of any annuity under sub-
11 chapter III of chapter 83 of title 5, United States Code.

1 (b) DEPOSIT.—A deposit under section 8334(j) of
2 title 5, United States Code, may not be required for any
3 period for which credit is allowed under this section.

4 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE; OTHER PROVISIONS.**

5 (a) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
7 graph (2), this Act shall be effective as of the date
8 of enactment of this Act.

9 (2) PAYMENT FOR EARLIER PERIODS.—Any
10 amounts payable to Fred Forrest by reason of this
11 Act for calendar months before the first calendar
12 month beginning after the effective date of this Act
13 shall be paid in a lump sum by the Secretary of the
14 Treasury, out of any money not otherwise appro-
15 priated, if application therefor is filed with such Sec-
16 retary by Fred Forrest within one year after the ef-
17 fective date of this Act.

18 (b) LIMITATION ON CERTAIN FEES.—No amount ex-
19 ceeding 10 percent of the lump-sum payment described in
20 subsection (a)(2) may be paid to or received by any attor-
21 ney or agent for services rendered in connection with such
22 payment. Any person who violates this subsection shall be
23 guilty of an infraction and shall be subject to a fine in
24 the amount provided under title 18, United States Code.
