A BILL

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. COMPENSATION FOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY**
4 **STUDY.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Treasury
6 shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
7 appropriated, \$_____ jointly to the persons
8 named in subsection (b) for damages sustained by such
9 persons in connection with the air installation compatible
10 use zone study conducted by the Secretary of the Army

1 with respect to Los Alamitos Army Airfield under part
2 256 of title 32, Code of Federal Regulations.

3 (b) PERSONS TO RECEIVE COMPENSATION.—The
4 Secretary of the Treasury shall compensate the following
5 persons under subsection (a):

6 (1) Sarabeth M. Davis of Clinton, Washington.

7 (2) Robert S. Borders of Newport Beach, Cali-
8 fornia.

9 (3) Victor Maron of Long Beach, California.

10 (4) Irving Berke of Long Beach, California.

11 (5) Adele E. Conrad of Cypress, California.

12 **SEC. 2. SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED**
13 **STATES.**

14 Payment under section 1 shall constitute full settle-
15 ment of all legal and equitable claims by the persons re-
16 ferred to in section 1(b) against the United States for the
17 damages described in section 1(a).

18 **SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON ATTORNEY AND AGENT FEES.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not more than 10 percent of the
20 payment made under section 1 may be paid to or received
21 by an agent or attorney as consideration for a service ren-
22 dered in connection with this Act.

23 (b) ENFORCEABILITY OF CONTRACT.—Each contract
24 that violates subsection (a) shall be unenforceable.

1 (c) CRIMINAL PENALTY.—Each violation of sub-
2 section (a) shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine
3 of not more than \$1,000.
