Mr. HASTINGS of Washington, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2466) making appropriations for the Department of the Interior and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2466) making appropriations for

1 the Department of the Interior and related agencies for
2 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for other
3 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
4 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
5 failure to comply with section 306 or 401 of the Congres-
6 sional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General debate
7 shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour
8 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
9 ing minority member of the Committee on Appropriations.
10 After general debate the bill shall be considered for
11 amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order
12 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with
13 clause 2 of rule XXI are waived except as follows: begin-
14 ning with “*Provided*” on page 37, line 23, through the
15 closing quotation mark on page 38, line 13; beginning with
16 “*Provided*” on page 59, line 13, through 22; beginning
17 with “and such new” on page 76, line 16, through 22;
18 and page 80, line 11, through “funding agreements” on
19 line 23. Where points of order are waived against part
20 of a paragraph, points of order against a provision in an-
21 other part of such paragraph may be made only against
22 such provision and not against the entire paragraph. The
23 amendment printed in the report of the Committee on
24 Rules accompanying this resolution may be offered only
25 by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered

1 as read, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not
2 be subject to a demand for division of the question in the
3 House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of
4 order against that amendment are waived. During consid-
5 eration of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the
6 Committee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition
7 on the basis of whether the Member offering an amend-
8 ment has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Con-
9 gressional Record designated for that purpose in clause
10 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be consid-
11 ered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole
12 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-
13 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-
14 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five
15 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any
16 postponed question that follows another electronic vote
17 without intervening business, provided that the minimum
18 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-
19 tions shall be 15 minutes. During consideration of the bill,
20 points of order against amendments for failure to comply
21 with clause 2(e) of rule XXI are waived. At the conclusion
22 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
23 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
24 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
25 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and

- 1 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
- 2 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
- 3 structions.

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
