Mr. NORWOOD submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1136) to increase the availability and choice of quality health care.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution the House shall without intervention of any
3 point of order resolve into the Committee of the Whole
4 House on the state of the Union for consideration of the
5 bill (H.R. 1136) to increase the availability and choice of
6 quality health care. The first reading of the bill shall be
7 dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the
8 bill and shall not exceed 120 minutes, with 60 minutes
9 of debate to be equally divided and controlled by the chair-
10 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on

1 Commerce, 30 minutes of debate to be equally divided and
2 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
3 of the Committee on Ways and Means and 30 minutes
4 of debate to be equally divided and controlled by the chair-
5 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
6 Education and the Workforce. After general debate the
7 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
8 minute rule. The bill shall be considered by title rather
9 than by section. Each title shall be considered as read.
10 During consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chair-
11 man of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority
12 in recognition on the basis of whether the member offering
13 an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion
14 of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose
15 in clause 8 in rule XVIII. At the conclusion of consider-
16 ation of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise
17 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
18 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall
19 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
20 thereto to final passage without intervening motion, except
21 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

22 SEC. 2. If the Committee of the Whole rises and re-
23 ports that it has come to no resolution on the bill, then
24 on the next legislative day the House shall, immediately
25 after the third daily order of business under clause 1 of

- 1 rule XIV, resolve into the Committee of the Whole for fur-
- 2 ther consideration of the bill.
