AN ACT

For the relief of Wei Jingsheng.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
3 “Wei Jingsheng Freedom of Conscience Act”.

4 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for
5 purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
6 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Wei Jingsheng shall be held and con-
7 sidered to have been lawfully admitted to the United
8 States for permanent residence as of the date of the enact-
9 ment of this Act upon payment of the required visa fee.

10 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Wei
12 Jingsheng as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State
13 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one during
14 the current fiscal year the total number of immigrant visas
15 available to natives of the country of the alien’s birth
16 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
17 Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
