A BILL

To amend title 36, United States Code, to designate the oak tree as the national tree of the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF NATIONAL TREE.**

4 (a) DESIGNATION.—Chapter 3 of title 36, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing:

7 **“§ 305. National tree**

8 “The tree genus *Quercus*, commonly known as the
9 oak tree, is the national tree.”.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Title 36 is
2 amended—

3 (1) in the table of contents for part A of sub-
4 title I, by striking “, **and March**” and inserting
5 “**March, and Tree**”;

6 (2) in the chapter head for chapter 3, by strik-
7 ing “, AND MARCH” and inserting “MARCH,
8 AND TREE”; and

9 (3) in the table of sections for chapter 3, by
10 adding at the end the following:

“305. National tree.”.
