## A BILL

To extend the deadline for commencement of construction of a hydroelectric project in Connecticut, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TIME FOR FEDERAL ENERGY**  
4 **REGULATORY COMMISSION PROJECT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the time period  
6 specified in section 13 of the Federal Power Act (16  
7 U.S.C. 806) that would otherwise apply to the Federal En-  
8 ergy Regulatory Commission project numbered 11547–  
9 005, the Commission shall, upon enactment of this Act,  
10 extend the time period during which the licensee is re-

1 quired to commence the construction of the project to and  
2 including May 30, 2003. Thereafter the Commission shall,  
3 at the request of the licensee for the project and after rea-  
4 sonable notice, in accordance with the good faith, due dili-  
5 gence, and public interest requirements of that section and  
6 the Commission's procedures under that section, extend  
7 the time period during which the licensee is required to  
8 commence the construction of the project for 2 consecutive  
9 2-year periods.

10 (b) REINSTATEMENT OF EXPIRED LICENSE.—The  
11 Commission shall reinstate the license for Federal Energy  
12 Regulatory Commission project numbered 11547–005 ef-  
13 fective as of the date of its expiration, and the first exten-  
14 sion authorized under subsection (a) shall take effect on  
15 the date of such expiration.
