Mr. RANGEL submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1076) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the incentives for the construction and renovation of public schools.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution the House shall without intervention of any
3 point of order consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1076)
4 to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand
5 the incentives for the construction and renovation of pub-
6 lic schools. The bill shall be considered as read for amend-
7 ment. The previous question shall be considered as ordered

1 on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final passage
2 without intervening motion except:

3 (1) 90 minutes of debate on the bill, with 60
4 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair-
5 man and ranking minority member of the Committee
6 on Ways and Means and 30 minutes equally divided
7 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
8 ity member of the Committee on Education and the
9 Workforce; and

10 (2) an amendment in the nature of a substitute,
11 if offered by Representative Thomas of California or
12 his designee, which shall be in order without inter-
13 vention of any point of order (except those arising
14 under clause 7 of rule XVI), shall be considered as
15 read, and shall be separately debatable for one hour
16 equally divided and controlled by the proponent and
17 an opponent; and

18 (3) one motion to recommit with or without in-
19 structions.
