A BILL

To further the protection and recognition of veterans' memorials, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans' Memorial
5 Preservation and Recognition Act of 2001".

1 **SEC. 2. VETERANS' MEMORIAL RESTORATION FUND.**

2 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—Part VI of title 38, United
3 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
4 lowing new chapter:

5 **“CHAPTER 87—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS**

“8701. Veterans' Memorial Restoration Fund.

6 **“§ 8701. Veterans' Memorial Restoration Fund**

7 “(a) There is established on the books of the Treas-
8 ury a fund to be known as the ‘Veterans' Memorial Res-
9 toration Fund’ (in this section referred to as the ‘Fund’).

10 “(b) There shall be deposited in the Fund amounts
11 as follows:

12 “(1) Amounts authorized to be appropriated to
13 the Fund.

14 “(2) Amounts collected as civil penalties under
15 section 1369(b) of title 18.

16 “(3) Amounts donated to the United States for
17 purposes of deposit in the Fund.

18 “(4) Any other amounts transferred to the
19 Fund by the Secretary under law.

20 “(c) Amounts in the Fund shall be available to the
21 Secretary as follows:

22 “(1) To cover the costs of the repair or restora-
23 tion of injuries or deprecations to veterans' memo-
24 rials.

1 son or persons in the armed forces of the United States,
2 shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than
3 10 years, or both, but if the damage or attempted damage
4 does not exceed the sum of \$1,000, the defendant shall
5 be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than one
6 year, or both.

7 “(b)(1) Whoever commits an offense described by
8 subsection (a) shall be subject to a civil penalty in an
9 amount equal to the cost of repairing the injury or depre-
10 dation upon which the offense is based.

11 “(2) A civil penalty for an offense under this sub-
12 section is in addition to any fine or penalty for the offense
13 under subsection (a) or any other provision of law.

14 “(3) Amounts collected under this subsection shall be
15 deposited in the Veterans’ Memorial Restoration Fund
16 under section 8701 of title 38, and available for use in
17 accordance with the provisions of subsection (c) of that
18 section.

19 “(c) The circumstance referred to in subsection (a)
20 is that in committing the offense, the defendant travels
21 or causes another to travel in interstate or foreign com-
22 merce, or uses the mail or an instrumentality of interstate
23 or foreign commerce.”.

1 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
2 at the beginning of chapter 65 of title 18, United States
3 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

“1369. Desecration of veterans’ memorials.”.

4 **SEC. 4. HIGHWAY SIGNS RELATING TO VETERANS CEME-**
5 **TERIES.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the terms of any
7 agreement entered into by the Secretary of Transportation
8 and a State under section 109(d) or 402(a) of title 23,
9 United States Code, a veterans cemetery shall be treated
10 as a site for which a supplemental guide sign may be
11 placed on any Federal-aid highway.

12 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply to an
13 agreement entered into before, on, or after the date of the
14 enactment of this Act.

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
