AN ACT

For the relief of Sung Jun Oh.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
3 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
4 1101 et seq.), Sung Jun Oh shall be held and considered
5 to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for
6 permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of
7 this Act upon payment of any necessary visa fees.

8 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

9 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Sung
10 Jun Oh, as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State
11 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one number
12 during the current fiscal year the total number of immi-
13 grant visas available to natives of the country of the alien's
14 birth under section 202(e) of the Immigration and Nation-
15 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).
