

**CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

1        *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*  
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**  
4 ******GROUND******

5        (a) IN GENERAL.—The Library of Congress (in this  
6 resolution referred to as the ‘sponsor’), in cooperation with  
7 the First Lady, may sponsor the National Book Festival  
8 (in this resolution referred to as the ‘event’) on the Capitol  
9 Grounds.

10        (b) DATE OF EVENT.—The event shall be held on  
11 September 8, 2001, or on such other date as the Senate  
12 Committee on Rules and Administration and the Speaker  
13 of the House of Representatives jointly designate.

14 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

15        (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed  
16 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police  
17 Board, the event authorized under section 1 shall be—

18                (1) free of admission charge and open to the  
19                public; and

1           (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of  
2       Congress.

3       (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall  
4       assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities  
5       incident to all activities associated with the event.

6       **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

7       (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the  
8       approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may  
9       cause to be placed on the Capitol Grounds such stage,  
10      seating, booths, sound amplification and video devices, and  
11      other related structures and equipment as may be required  
12      for the event, including equipment for the broadcast of  
13      the event over radio, television, and other media outlets.

14      (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of  
15      the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board may make any  
16      additional arrangements as may be required to carry out  
17      the event.

18      **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

19      The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
20      ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act  
21      of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-  
22      cerning sales, displays, advertisements, and solicitations

1 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-  
2 cable to the Capitol Grounds in connection with the event.
