3 **SECTION 1. EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN WIRE RODS FROM**
4 **ANTIDUMPING AND COUNTERVAILING DUTY**
5 **ORDERS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
7 sion of law, any antidumping or countervailing duty order
8 that is issued as a result of antidumping investigations

1 A-351-832, A-122-840, A-428-832, A-560-815, A-
2 201-830, A-841-805, A-274-804, and A-823-812, or
3 countervailing duty investigations C-351-833, C-122-
4 841, C-428-833, C-274-805, and C-489-809, relating to
5 carbon and certain alloy steel rods, shall not include wire
6 rods that meet the American Welding Society ER70S-6
7 classification and are used to produce Mig Wire.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
10 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
11 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.
