CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for acceptance of a statue of Po'Pay, presented by the State of New Mexico, for placement in National Statuary Hall, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. ACCEPTANCE OF STATUE OF PO'PAY FROM THE**
2 **PEOPLE OF NEW MEXICO FOR PLACEMENT IN**
3 **NATIONAL STATUARY HALL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The statue of Po'Pay, furnished
5 by the people of New Mexico for placement in National
6 Statuary Hall in accordance with section 1814 of the Re-
7 vised Statutes of the United States (2 U.S.C. 2131), is
8 accepted in the name of the United States, and the thanks
9 of the Congress are tendered to the people of New Mexico
10 for providing this commemoration of one of New Mexico's
11 most eminent personages.

12 (b) PRESENTATION CEREMONY.—The State of New
13 Mexico is authorized to use the Rotunda of the Capitol
14 on September 22, 2005, for a presentation ceremony for
15 the statue. The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol
16 Police Board shall take such action as may be necessary
17 with respect to physical preparations and security for the
18 ceremony.

19 (c) DISPLAY IN ROTUNDA.—The statue shall be dis-
20 played in the Rotunda of the Capitol for a period of not
21 more than 6 months, after which period the statue shall
22 be moved to its permanent location in the National Stat-
23 uary Hall Collection.

1 **SEC. 2. TRANSMITTAL TO GOVERNOR OF NEW MEXICO.**

2 The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
3 transmit an enrolled copy of this concurrent resolution to
4 the Governor of New Mexico.
