Mr. BARROW submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5099) to provide disaster assistance to agricultural producers for crop and livestock losses, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That immediately after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker shall, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 5099) to provide disaster assistance  
6 to agricultural producers for crop and livestock losses, and  
7 for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be  
8 dispensed with. All points of order against the bill and  
9 against its consideration are waived. General debate shall

1 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
2 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
3 nority member of the Committee on Agriculture, and 20  
4 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman  
5 and ranking minority member of each of the Committees  
6 on the Budget, Transportation and Infrastructure, Armed  
7 Services, and Resources. After general debate the bill shall  
8 be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule.  
9 The bill shall be considered as read. It shall be in order  
10 to consider an amendment in the nature of a substitute  
11 if offered by Representative Peterson of Minnesota (or his  
12 designee). All points of order against the amendment (ex-  
13 cept for those arising under clause 7 of rule XVI) are  
14 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for  
15 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill  
16 to the House with such amendments as may have been  
17 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the  
18 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of  
19 the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature  
20 of a substitute offered by Mr. Peterson of Minnesota (or  
21 his designee). The previous question shall be considered  
22 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final  
23 passage without intervening motion except one motion to  
24 recommit with or without instructions.
