Mr. LIEBERMAN (for himself, Ms. COLLINS, and Mr. CRAIG) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To reauthorize the Congressional Award Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REAUTHORIZATION OF THE CONGRESSIONAL**
4 **AWARD ACT.**

5 (a) EXTENSION OF REQUIREMENTS REGARDING FI-
6 NANCIAL OPERATIONS OF CONGRESSIONAL AWARD PRO-
7 GRAM; NONCOMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS.—Section
8 104(c)(2)(A) of the Congressional Award Act (2 U.S.C.
9 804(c)(2)(A)) is amended by striking “and 2004” and in-
10 serting “2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2009”.

11 (b) TERMINATION.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 108 of the Congres-
2 sional Award Act (2 U.S.C. 808) is amended by
3 striking “October 1, 2004” and inserting “October
4 1, 2009”.

5 (2) SAVINGS PROVISION.—During the period of
6 October 1, 2004, through the date of the enactment
7 of this section, all actions and functions of the Con-
8 gressional Award Board under the Congressional
9 Award Act (2 U.S.C. 801 et seq.) shall have the
10 same effect as though no lapse or termination of the
11 Board ever occurred.

12 (c) TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.—The Congressional
13 Award Act is amended—

14 (1) in section 103 (2 U.S.C. 803)—

15 (A) in subsection (a)(1) (B) and (C), by
16 striking “a a local” and inserting “a local”; and

17 (B) in subsection (b)(3)(B), by striking
18 “section” each place it appears and inserting
19 “subsection”; and

20 (2) in section 104(c)(2)(A) (2 U.S.C.
21 804(c)(2)(A)), by inserting a comma after “1993”.

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
