Mr. EHLERS submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the printing of a commemorative document in memory of the late President of the United States, Gerald Rudolph Ford.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. COMMEMORATIVE DOCUMENT AUTHORIZED.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—A commemorative document in
5 memory of the late President of the United States, Gerald
6 Rudolph Ford, shall be printed as a House document, with
7 illustrations and suitable binding, under the direction of
8 the Joint Committee on Printing.

9 (b) CONTENTS.—The document shall consist of the
10 eulogies and encomiums for Gerald Rudolph Ford, as ex-

1 pressed in the Senate and the House of Representatives,
2 together with the texts of each of the following:

3 (1) The funeral ceremony at Palm Desert, Cali-
4 fornia.

5 (2) The state funeral ceremony at the rotunda
6 of the United States Capitol.

7 (3) The national funeral service held at the
8 Washington National Cathedral in the District of
9 Columbia.

10 (4) The interment ceremony at the Gerald Ford
11 Presidential Museum, Grand Rapids, Michigan.

12 **SEC. 2. PRINTING OF DOCUMENT.**

13 In addition to the usual number of copies printed of
14 the commemorative document under section 1, there shall
15 be printed the lesser of—

16 (1) 32,500 copies, of which 22,150 copies shall
17 be for the use of the House of Representatives and
18 10,350 copies shall be for the use of the Senate; or

19 (2) such number of copies that does not exceed
20 a production and printing cost of \$600,000, with
21 distribution of the copies to be allocated in the same
22 proportion as described in paragraph (1).
