Mr. GOODE introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to the process by which the House of Representatives selects the President in the event no candidate receives a majority of electoral votes.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
2 for ratification:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “SECTION 1. Whenever the right to choose the Presi-
5 dent devolves upon the House of Representatives, the
6 Members of the House shall cast votes on an individual
7 basis, and the candidate receiving votes cast by a majority
8 of the Members of the House shall be the President.

9 “SECTION 2. For purposes of a meeting of the House
10 to cast votes under section 1, two-thirds of the Members
11 of the House shall constitute a quorum.”.
