AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to proclaim as reservation for the benefit of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians a parcel of land now held in trust by the United States for that Indian tribe.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. LAND TO BE PROCLAIMED RESERVATION.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
3 sion of law, the Secretary of the Interior shall proclaim
4 as reservation for the benefit of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe
5 of Chippewa Indians the parcel of land now held in trust
6 by the United States and having the legal description as
7 follows: That portion of Section 19, Township 41 North,
8 Range 3 West, Michigan Meridian, described as: All of the
9 NW1/4SW1/4 and all of the S1/2SW1/4 Northerly of a
10 line described as beginning 650 feet Northerly along the
11 centerline of Highway “Mackinac Trail” from the intersec-
12 tion of said centerline with the South Section line of Sec-
13 tion 19, Township 41 North, Range 3 West, thence North-
14 easterly to the Southeast corner of the NW1/4SW1/4 of
15 said Section, containing 65 acres, more or less (except the
16 highway right-of-way and easements of record).

17 (b) APPLICABLE LAW; EFFECTIVE DATE.—The Sec-
18 retary’s proclamation shall be pursuant to section 7 of the
19 Act of June 18, 1934 (25 U.S.C. 467) and the property
20 shall be deemed a reservation as of April 19, 1988, for
21 purposes of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act.
