Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1905) to provide for the treatment of the District of Columbia as a Congressional district for purposes of representation in the House of Representatives, and for other purposes and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1906) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to adjust the estimated tax payment safe harbor based on income for the preceding year in the case of individuals with adjusted gross income greater than \$5 million.

Mr. ARCURI, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1905) to provide for the treatment of the District of Columbia as a Congressional district for purposes of representation in the House of Representatives, and for other purposes and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1906) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to adjust the estimated tax payment safe harbor based on income for the preceding year in the case of individuals with adjusted gross income greater than \$5 million.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 1905) to provide for the treatment of the District of Co-
4 lumbia as a Congressional district for purposes of rep-
5 resentation in the House of Representatives, and for other
6 purposes. All points of order against the bill and against
7 its consideration are waived except those arising under
8 clause 9 of rule XXI. The bill shall be considered as read.
9 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
10 the bill to final passage without intervening motion except:
11 (1) one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by
12 the chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-
13 mittee on the Judiciary; and (2) one motion to recommit.

14 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
15 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1906)
16 to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to adjust
17 the estimated tax payment safe harbor based on income
18 for the preceding year in the case of individuals with ad-
19 justed gross income greater than \$5 million. All points of
20 order against the bill and against its consideration are
21 waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule
22 XXI. The bill shall be considered as read. The previous
23 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill to final
24 passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour
25 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chairman

1 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways
2 and Means; and (2) one motion to recommit.

3 SEC. 3. (a) If either H.R. 1905 or H.R. 1906 fails
4 of passage or fails to reach the question of passage by
5 an order of recommittal, then both such bills, together
6 with H.R. 1433, shall be laid on the table.

7 (b) In the engrossment of H.R. 1905, the Clerk
8 shall—

9 (1) add the text of H.R. 1906, as passed by the
10 House, as new matter at the end of H.R. 1905;

11 (2) conform the title of H.R. 1905 to reflect the
12 addition of the text H.R. 1906 to the engrossment;

13 (3) assign appropriate designations to provi-
14 sions within the engrossment; and

15 (4) conform provisions for short titles within
16 the engrossment.

17 (c) Upon the addition of the text of H.R. 1906 to
18 the engrossment of H.R. 1905, H.R. 1906 and H.R. 1433
19 shall be laid on the table.

20 SEC. 4. During consideration of H.R. 1905 or H.R.
21 1906 pursuant to this resolution, notwithstanding the op-
22 eration of the previous question, the Chair may postpone
23 further consideration of either bill to such time as may
24 be designated by the Speaker.

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
