RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3254) to approve the Taos Pueblo Indian Water Rights Settlement Agreement, and for other purposes; for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3342) to authorize the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Commissioner of Reclamation, to develop water infrastructure in the Rio Grande Basin, and to approve the settlement of the water rights claims of the Pueblos of Nambe, Pojoaque,

San Ildefonso, and Tesuque; and for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1065) to resolve water rights claims of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the State of Arizona, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 3254) to approve the Taos Pueblo Indian Water Rights
4 Settlement Agreement, and for other purposes. All points
5 of order against consideration of the bill are waived except
6 those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. The
7 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by
8 the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the
9 bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended,
10 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
11 provisions of the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
12 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
13 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
14 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
15 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
16 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Nat-
17 ural Resources; (2) the further amendment printed in part
18 A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
19 this resolution, if offered by Representative McClintock of
20 California or his designee, which shall be in order without
21 intervention of any point of order except those arising
22 under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI, shall be considered as

1 read, shall be separately debatable for 10 minutes equally
2 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
3 and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the
4 question; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without
5 instructions.

6 SEC. 2. Upon the adoption of this resolution it shall
7 be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3342)
8 to authorize the Secretary of the Interior, acting through
9 the Commissioner of Reclamation, to develop water infra-
10 structure in the Rio Grande Basin, and to approve the
11 settlement of the water rights claims of the Pueblos of
12 Nambe, Pojoaque, San Ildefonso, and Tesuque. All points
13 of order against consideration of the bill are waived except
14 those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. The
15 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by
16 the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the
17 bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended,
18 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
19 provisions of the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
20 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
21 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
22 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
23 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
24 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Nat-
25 ural Resources; (2) the further amendment printed in part

1 B of the report of the Committee on Rules, if offered by
2 Representative McClintock of California or his designee,
3 which shall be in order without intervention of any point
4 of order except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule
5 XXI, shall be considered as read, shall be separately de-
6 batable for 10 minutes equally divided and controlled by
7 the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject
8 to a demand for division of the question; and (3) one mo-
9 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

10 SEC. 3. Upon the adoption of this resolution it shall
11 be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1065)
12 to resolve water rights claims of the White Mountain
13 Apache Tribe in the State of Arizona, and for other pur-
14 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill
15 are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of
16 rule XXI. The amendment in the nature of a substitute
17 recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources
18 now printed in the bill, modified by the amendment print-
19 ed in part C of the report of the Committee on Rules,
20 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall
21 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
22 sions of the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous
23 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as
24 amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to final
25 passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour

1 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and
2 ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural
3 Resources; (2) the further amendment printed in part D
4 of the report of the Committee on Rules, if offered by Rep-
5 resentative McClintock of California or his designee, which
6 shall be in order without intervention of any point of order
7 except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI,
8 shall be considered as read, shall be separately debatable
9 for 10 minutes equally divided and controlled by the pro-
10 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a
11 demand for division of the question; and (3) one motion
12 to recommit with or without instructions.
