1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Eliminating Govern-3 ment-funded Oil-painting Act" or the "EGO Act".

4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS FOR PORTRAITS.

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—No funds appropriated or other-6 wise made available to the Federal Government may be 7 used to pay for the painting of a portrait of an officer 8 or employee of the Federal Government, including the 9 President, the Vice President, a Member of Congress, the 10 head of an executive agency, or the head of an office of 11 the legislative branch.

- 12 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—
- (1) the term "executive agency" has the meaning given the term in section 133 of title 41, United
 States Code; and
- 16 (2) the term "Member of Congress" includes a
 17 Delegate or Resident Commissioner to Congress.
