- 9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
- 10 (b), if the victim of an offense under section 2261A is
- 11 under the age of 18 years, the maximum imprisonment
- 12 for the offense is 5 years greater than the maximum term
- 13 of imprisonment otherwise provided for that offense in sec-

- 15 "(b) LIMITATION.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to
- 16 a person who violates section 2261A if—
- "(1) the person is subject to a sentence under
- 18 section 2261(b)(5); and
- 19 "(2)(A) the person is under the age of 18 at
- the time the offense occurred; or
- 21 "(B) the victim of the offense is not less than
- 22 15 nor more than 17 years of age and not more
- 23 than 3 years younger than the person who com-
- 24 mitted the offense at the time the offense oc-
- curred.".
