PENDING BUSINESS

S. 1955 (ORDER NO. 417)

A bill to amend title I of the Employee Retirement Security Act of 1974 and the Public Health Service Act to expand health care access and reduce costs through the creation of small business health plans and through modernization of the health insurance marketplace. (*May 10, 2006.*)

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 2611 (ORDER NO. 414)

1.—*Ordered*, That on Wednesday, May 24, 2006, at 8:30 a.m., the Senate resume consideration of S. 2611, a bill to provide for comprehensive immigration reform and for other purposes; provided, that the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell) be recognized to offer Amdt. No. 4085, and that the time until 9:30 a.m. be equally divided between the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell) and the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid), or his designee; provided further, that at 9:30 a.m. the Senate proceed to a vote in relation to Amdt. No. 4085 and that no second degree amendments be in order to the amendment prior to the vote; further, that following the vote on Amdt. No. 4085, the Senate proceed to a vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the bill; further, that the filing deadline for second degree amendments under Rule XXII be no later than 10:00 a.m., on Wednesday, May 24, 2006.

Ordered further, That relative to the cloture motion filed on S. 2611, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That following the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the bill, the next first degree amendment in order shall be Amdt. No. 4036, offered by the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Lieberman); provided further, that following Amdt. No. 4036, the next first degree amendments in order be the following:

Gregg—Amdt. No. 4114
 Hutchison—Amdt. No. 4101
 Burns—Amdt. No. 4124
 Chambliss—Amdt. No. 4084
 Cornyn—Amdt. No. 4097
 Sessions—Amdt. No. 4108
 Kyl—Amdt. No. 4134.

Ordered further, That it be in order to have first degree amendments offered by the Democratic Leader or his designee between each of these Republican amendments; further, that if cloture is invoked on the bill and if any of the above listed amendments have not been offered prior to the expiration of time under Rule XXII, then it be in order to call up any such amendment prior to the third reading of the bill; provided further, that notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII it be in order at any time during the consideration of these amendments to consider a managers' amendment which has been cleared by both managers.

Ordered further, That when the Senate agrees to a request for a conference or the Senate requests a conference on S. 2611 or a House bill, as amended with the language of S. 2611, as amended, if amended, the Chair be authorized to appoint conferees on the part of the Senate with the ratio of conferees being 14 to 12; provided further, that from that ratio, the first 7 Republican Senators from the Committee on the Judiciary and the first 5 Democratic Senators from the Committee on the Judiciary be conferees; further, that the Majority Leader select the final 7 conferees for the Majority side and the Democratic Leader select the final 7 conferees for the Minority side. (*May 11, 22, 23, 2006.*)

H.R. 22

2.—*Ordered*, That with respect to H.R. 22, an act to reform the postal laws of the United States, provided it shall not be in order for the Senate to consider any conference report or any House amendments to H.R. 22, if it would cause a net increase in on or off budget direct spending in excess of \$5 billion in any of the four 10-year periods beginning in 2016–2055, as estimated by the Congressional Budget Office. (*Feb. 9, 2006.*)

S. 295

3.—*Ordered*, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader, shall no later than September 29, 2006, or the last day of the second session of the

109th Congress, whichever is earliest, call up S. 295, a bill to authorize appropriate action if the negotiations with the People's Republic of China regarding China's undervalued currency are not successful; provided that if the bill has not been reported by then by the Committee on Finance it be discharged at that time and the Senate proceed to the consideration thereof; that there be 2 hours for debate equally divided between the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Grassley) and the Democratic Leader, or his designee, that no amendments or motions be in order, including committee amendments, that after the use or yielding back of time, the bill be read a third time and the Senate proceed to a vote on passage of the bill, with no intervening action or debate. (*July 1, 2005, Mar. 29, 2006.*)
