PENDING BUSINESS

S. 2248 (ORDER NO. 512)

A bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978, to modernize and streamline the provisions of that act, and for other purposes. (*Dec. 17, 2007.*)

PENDING BUSINESS

S. 1200 (ORDER NO. 421)

A bill to amend the Indian Health Care Improvement Act to revise and extend that act. (*Jan. 22, 2008.*)

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 2248 (ORDER NO. 512)

1.—*Ordered*, That on Wednesday, February 6, 2008, upon the conclusion of Morning Business, the Senate resume consideration of S. 2248, a bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978, to modernize and streamline the provisions of that act, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That the following be the only first degree amendments remaining in order to the bill, with no second degree amendments prior to a vote, except as specified in this agreement; that any time for debate with respect to amendments be equally divided and controlled in the usual form.

Ordered further, That the following amendments be subject to a majority vote threshold, with a motion to table any of these amendments in order:

Amdt. Nos. 3941 & 3938, offered by the Senator from Missouri (Mr. Bond), each with a modification—20 minutes of debate on each;

Amdt. No. 3907, offered by the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd) and the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold)—2 hours of debate;

Amdt. No. 3927, offered by the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. Specter) and the Senator from Rhode Island (Mr. Whitehouse)—2 hours of debate;

Amdt. Nos. 3913, 3912, 3915, offered by the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold)—40 minutes of debate each;

Amdt. No. 3979, offered by the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold) and the Senator from Virginia (Mr. Webb)—90 minutes of debate; and

Amdt. No. 3910, offered by the Senator from California (Mrs. Feinstein), without any debate limitation.

Ordered further, That the final three amendments listed be subject to a 60 affirmative vote threshold, and that if an amendment does not achieve that threshold, the amendment be withdrawn:

Amdt. No. 3919, offered by the Senator from California (Mrs. Feinstein)—2 hours of debate;

Amdt. No. 3930, offered by the Senator from Maryland (Mr. Cardin)—60 minutes of debate; and

Amdt. No. 3920, offered by the Senator from Rhode Island (Mr. Whitehouse)—60 minutes of debate.

Ordered further, That a managers' amendment be in order if cleared by the managers and the Leaders.

Ordered further, That upon disposition of all amendments, the substitute amendment, as amended, be agreed to, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate then vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the bill; provided, that upon passage of the bill, the Senate then proceed to Calendar No. 517, H.R. 3773, a bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to establish a procedure for authorizing certain acquisitions of foreign intelligence, and for other purposes; provided, that all after the enacting clause be stricken, and the text of S. 2248, as amended, be inserted in lieu thereof, the bill be advanced to third reading, passed and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; provided further, that passage of S. 2248 be vitiated and then returned to the Calendar. (*Jan. 31, Feb. 5, 2008.*)

H.R. 5140 (ORDER NO. 566)

2.—*Ordered*, That at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, February 6, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 5140, an act to provide economic stimulus through recovery rebates to individuals, incentives for business investment, and an increase in conforming and FHA loan limits; provided that the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on Amdt. No. 3983, offered by the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid) occur at 5:45 p.m.; provided further, that the time from 4:30 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. be for debate with respect to the cloture motion, with the time equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees, with the final 30 minutes prior to the vote divided equally between the two Leaders with the Majority Leader controlling the final 15 minutes.

Ordered further, That the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That Members have until 4:00 p.m. to file any germane second degree amendments. (*Feb. 5, 2008.*)

S. 1974

3.—*Ordered*, That upon passage of S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, the bill remain at the desk until such time as the Senate receives a companion measure from the House.

Ordered further, That when the Senate receives a companion measure from the House, the Senate then proceed to its consideration; provided, that all after the enacting clause be stricken and the text of S. 1974, as amended, be inserted, in lieu thereof; provided further, that the bill be read a third time, passed and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table without further intervening action or debate, and that S. 1974 then be returned to the calendar. (*Dec. 19, 2007.*)

S. 2483 (ORDER NO. 546)

4.—*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. 2483, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Forest Service, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Energy, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That it be considered under the following limitations: that the only amendments in order be five related amendments to be offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn), and that upon disposition of all amendments, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate proceed to vote in the passage of the bill. (*Dec. 19, 2007.*)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

5.—*Ordered*, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (*June 20, 2007.*)

H.R. 3997

6.—*Ordered*, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (*Dec. 12, 19, 2007.*)
