## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

## S. 2230 (ORDER NO. 339)

1.-Ordered, That following any Leader remarks on Monday, April 16, 2012, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S . 2230, a bill to reduce the deficit by imposing a minimum effective tax rate for high-income taxpayers; provided, that the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed occur on Monday, April 16, 2012, when the Senate resumes Legislative Session following the vote on confirmation of the Thacker nomination.

Ordered further, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S. 2230, that the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Mar. 29, 2012.)

## S. 1789 (ORDER NO. 296)

2.-Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S. 1789, a bill to improve, sustain, and transform the United States Postal Service, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Mar. 22, 2012.)

## S. 1813

3.-Ordered, That S. 1813, a bill to reauthorize Federal-aid highway and highway safety construction programs, and for other purposes, as amended and passed, be held at the desk.

Ordered further, That when the Senate receives from the House a companion to $S$. 1813 (as determined by the two Leaders), it be in order for the Majority Leader to proceed to its immediate consideration, that all after the enacting clause be stricken and the text of S. 1813, as passed by the Senate be inserted in lieu thereof; provided, that the House bill, as amended, be read a third time, a statutory PAYGO statement be read (if necessary), the bill, as amended, be passed, and the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; provided further, that upon passage, the Senate insist on its amendment, request a conference with the House on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and the Chair be authorized to appoint conferees on the part of the Senate.
