G.K. BUTTERFIELD, Democrat, of Wilson County, NC; born on April 27, 1947; education: North Carolina Central University, graduated in 1971, with degrees in Sociology and Political Science; North Carolina Central University School of Law, graduated in 1974, with a Juris Doctor degree; military service: U.S. Army, 1968-1970; served as a Personnel Specialist; discharged with the rank of Specialist E-4; profession: Attorney; private practice, 1974-1988; public service: elected to the North Carolina Superior Court bench in November, 1988; appointed on February 8, 2001, by Governor Michael F. Easley to the North Carolina Supreme Court; after leaving the Supreme Court, following the 2002 election, Governor Easley appointed Justice Butterfield as a Special Superior Court Judge; served until his retirement on May 7, 2004; organizations: North Carolina Bar Association; North Carolina Association of Black Lawyers; Wilson Opportunities Industrialization Center; religion: Baptist; elected to the 108th Congress, by special election, on July 20, 2004.
