to avoid breathing vapors, mists or aerosols. Inhalation exposures should be limited to $< 0.05 \text{ mg/m}^3$ as an 8-hour time-weighted average (TWA) for combined polyisocyanates controls diisocyanates. Engineering should serve as the first, most effective of reducing airborne means polyisocyanate and diisocyanate concentrations; an appropriate National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health/Mine Safety and Health Administration (NIOSH/MSHA) approved respirator should be used as a secondary tool to lower exposures. Currently, downdraft spray booths and high-volume low-pressure (HVLP) spray guns appear to offer the most efficient technology to reduce inhalation exposures; a maintenance program should always be used to ensure optimal operating efficiencies. To limit dermal contact, individuals should wear impermeable gloves, protective clothing and goggles or glasses with side shields.
