NEW PUBLIC LAWS

H.R. 2981, to extend energy conservation programs under the Energy Policy and Conservation Act through March 31, 2000. Signed October 5, 1999. (P.L. 106-64)

S. 1059, to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2000 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe personnel strengths for such fiscal year for the Armed Forces. Signed October 5, 1999. (P.L. 106-65)

S. 293, to direct the Secretaries of Agriculture and Interior to convey certain lands in San Juan County, New Mexico, to San Juan College. Signed October 6, 1999. (P.L. 106-66)

S. 944, to amend Public Law 105-188 to provide for the mineral leasing of certain Indian lands in Oklahoma. Signed October 6, 1999. (P.L. 106-67)

S. 1072, to make certain technical and other corrections relating to the Centennial of Flight Commemoration Act. Signed October 6, 1999. (P.L. 106-68)

The public proceedings of each House of Congress, as reported by the Official Reporters thereof, are printed pursuant to directions of the Joint Committee on Printing as authorized by appropriate provisions of Title 44, United States Code, and published for each day that one or both Houses are in session, excepting very infrequent instances when two or more unusually small consecutive issues are printed at one time. ¶Public access to the Congressional Record is available online through *GPO Access*, a service of the Government Printing Office, free of charge to the user. The online database is updated each day the Congressional Record is published. The database includes both text and graphics from the beginning of the 103d Congress, 2d session (January 1994) forward. It is available on the Wide Area Information Server (WAIS) through the Internet and via asynchronous dial-in. Internet users can access the database by using the World Wide Web; the Superintendent of Documents home page address is http://www.access.gpo.gov/su_docs, by using local WAIS client software or by telnet to swais.access.gpo.gov, then login as guest (no password required). Dial-in users should use communications software and modem to call (202) 512-1661; type swais, then login as guest (no password required).
