NEW PUBLIC LAWS

H.J. Res. 80, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2000. Signed November 18, 1999. (P.L. 106-105)

H.J. Res. 83, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2000. Signed November 19, 1999. (P.L. 106-106)

S. 468, to improve the effectiveness and performance of Federal financial assistance programs, simplify Federal financial assistance application and reporting requirements, and improve the delivery of services to the public. Signed November 20, 1999. (P.L. 106-107)

H.R. 2454, to assure the long-term conservation of mid-continent light geese and the biological diversity of the ecosystem upon which many North American migratory birds depend, by directing the Secretary of the Interior to implement rules to reduce the overabundant population of mid-continent

light geese. Signed November 24, 1999. (P.L. 106-108)

H.R. 2724, to make technical corrections to the Water Resources Development Act of 1999. Signed November 24, 1999. (P.L. 106-109)

S. 1235, to amend part G of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to allow railroad police officers to attend the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy for law enforcement training. Signed November 24, 1999. (P.L. 106-110)

H.R. 100, to establish designations for United States Postal Service buildings in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-111)

H.R. 197, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service at 410 North 6th Street in Garden City, Kansas, as the "Clifford R. Hope Post Office". Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-112)

H.R. 3194, making consolidated appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000. Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-113)

S. 278, to direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain lands to the county of Rio Arriba, New Mexico. Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-114)

S. 382, to establish the Minuteman Missile National Historic Site in the State of South Dakota. Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-115)

S. 1398, to clarify certain boundaries on maps relating to the Coastal Barrier Resources System. Signed November 29, 1999. (P.L. 106-116)

H.R. 2116, to amend title 38, United States Code, to enhance programs providing health care, education, memorial, and other benefits for veterans, to authorize major medical facility projects for the Department of Veterans Affairs. Signed November 30, 1999. (P.L. 106–117)

H.R. 2280, to amend title 38, United States Code, to provide a cost-of-living adjustment in rates

of compensation paid for service-connected disabilities, to enhance the compensation, memorial affairs, and housing programs of the Department of Veterans Affairs, to improve retirement authorities applicable to judges of the United States Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims. Signed November 30, 1999. (P.L. 106–118)
