During consideration of this measure today, Senate also took the following action:

By 46 yeas to 52 nays (Vote No. 210), three-fifths of those Senators duly chosen and sworn not having voted in the affirmative, Senate rejected the motion to waive the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 with respect to consideration of Grassley Amendment No. 845, to strike provisions relating to customs user fees and Medicare payment delay. Subsequently, a point of order that the amendment was in violation of section 302(f) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 was sustained, and the amendment thus fell.

By 57 yeas to 41 nays (Vote No. 214), Senate sustained a point of order that Smith (OR) Modified Motion to Commit to the Committee on Finance with instructions to report the bill back to the Senate with an amendment, is a motion that affects revenues on a bill originating in the Senate, and not in the House of Representatives as prescribed by the United States Constitution; therefore, the motion is not in order under the Constitution.
