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State of the Union Address: The House agreed to H. Con. Res. 12, providing for a joint session of Congress to receive a message from the President on Tuesday, January 28 at 9 p.m. on the State of the Union.

FURTHER CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003

Committee on Rules: Granted, by voice vote, a closed rule providing 1 hour of debate in the House on H.J. Res. 13, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2003. The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the joint resolution. The rule provides one motion to recommit. Finally, the rule provides that Section 2 of the resolution provides that upon receipt of a message from the Senate transmitting H.J. Res. 2 with a Senate amendment thereto, it shall be in order to consider in the House a motion offered by the chairman of the Committee on Appropriations or his designee that the House disagree to the Senate amendment and request or agree to a conference with the Senate thereon.
