The Committee held a markup of the following bills: H.R. 267, the “Hydropower Regulatory Efficiency Act of 2013”; H.R. 316, the “Collinsville Renewable Energy Promotion Act”; H.R. 297, to amend the Public Health Service Act to reauthorize support for graduate medical education programs in children's hospitals; H.R. 225, the “National Pediatric Research Network Act of 2013”; and H.R. 235, the

“Veteran Emergency Medical Technician Support Act of 2013”. All of the measures were ordered reported, without amendment.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING AND WASTING INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DOLLARS: HOW CAN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT REFORM ITS IT INVESTMENT STRATEGY?

Committee on Oversight and Government Reform: Full Committee met for organizational purposes. The Committee adopted its rules for the 113th Congress. PAYMENT OBLIGATIONS OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT

Committee on Rules: Full Committee held a hearing on H.R. 325, to ensure the complete and timely payment of the obligations of the United States Government until May 19, 2013, and for other purposes. The Committee granted, by a record vote of 9 to 3, a closed rule for H.R. 325. The rule provides one hour of debate, with 40 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and Means and 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on House Administration. The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The rule provides that the amendment printed in the Rules Committee report shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The rule waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The rule provides one motion to recommit with or without instructions. Testimony was heard from Chairman Ryan (WI) and Chairman Miller (MI), and Representatives Levin and Brady (PA).
