Fallen Firefighters Assistance Tax Clarification Act: Senate passed H.R. 3458, to treat payments by charitable organizations with respect to certain firefighters as exempt payments. **Page S8814**

Patterson, Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Jeh Charles Johnson, of New Jersey, to be Secretary of Homeland Security; that if cloture is invoked on the nomination of Jeh Charles Johnson, all post-cloture time be yielded back and Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination of Jeh Charles Johnson, of New Jersey, to be Secretary of Homeland Security. **Pages S8795–96**
