H.R. 908, to preserve the Green Mountain Lookout in the Glacier Peak Wilderness of the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest (H. Rept. 113–328);

H.R. 915, to authorize the Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–329, Pt. 1);

H.R. 1308, to amend the Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 to reduce predation on endangered Columbia River salmon and other nonlisted species, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–330);

H.R. 2166, to direct the Secretary of the Interior and Secretary of Agriculture to expedite access to certain Federal lands under the administrative jurisdiction of each Secretary for good Samaritan search-and-recovery missions, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–331, Pt. 1); and

H.R. 7, to prohibit taxpayer funded abortions (H. Rept. 113–332, Pt. 1). **Pages H1251–52**
