This Act may be cited as the “Military Construction Appropriations Act, 2002”.

Mr. WATTS of Oklahoma. Mr. Speaker; as a result of the tragic events of September 11, 2001, I was involved in an Inter-Faith Alliance Ministry meeting this morning at your request. Due to my participation in this meeting, I was not present for the vote on H.R. 2904, The Military Construction Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2002. Had I been present for this vote, I would have voted “aye.”
