DEFENSE PRODUCTION ACT AMENDMENTS OF 2001

Senate amendment:

Page 2, strike out all after line 8 down to and including line 14 and insert “2002”.

SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

Section 711(b) of the Defense Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. App. 2161(b)) is amended by striking “2001” and inserting “2002”.
