REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 584]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 584, by a record vote of 7 to 2, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for further consideration of H.R. 4274, “The Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Bill for FY 1999,” pursuant to House Resolution 564. The rule provides one hour of general debate divided equally between the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations.

The rule makes in order, before consideration of any other amendments, the amendments numbered 2 and 3 that were printed in the Rules Committee report (105-762) that accompanied House Resolution 564.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS MADE IN ORDER

Greenwood/Castle—30 minutes: Strikes the language mandating parental consent or notification for Title X programs, and it substitutes parental involvement and an emphasis on abstinence for minors seeking contraceptive drugs or devices. Provides Title X counselors with state of the art training on how to effectively intervene with minors to encourage abstinence, parental involvement and to avoid coercion, and it requires the Secretary of HHS to develop protocols in these areas, especially as they relate to younger adolescents.

Istook/Barcia/Manzullo—30 minutes: Substitute amendment to the Greenwood/Castle amendment, consisting of the Istook Title X language already in the bill and the Greenwood/Castle abstinence language.
