SPECIAL REPORT ON COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

SUMMARY

The Committee on Energy and Natural Resources conducted an extensive oversight and legislative program during the 107th Congress. A total of 326 bills and resolutions, 34 nominations, 1 Presidential message, and 266 Executive Communications were referred to the Committee for consideration.

The Committee held 104 days of public hearings, including 11 field hearings and one closed hearing during the 107th Congress. These hearings encompassed 49 days of oversight, 39 days of legislative, and 16 days of nomination hearings. The Committee also held 17 business meetings.

Action was completed on a broad range of oversight, legislative, and executive matters. Legislatively, 127 bills or resolutions were reported by the Committee, and the Committee was discharged of 8 other matters.

The Congress enacted a total of 72 public laws within the jurisdiction of the Committee. In addition, 14 Senate-passed measures within the jurisdiction of the Committee were pending before the House of Representatives when the 107th Congress adjourned sine die. Sixty-two other measures reported by the Committee were pending on the Senate Calendar or being held at the desk.

Two nominations submitted by President Clinton and 32 nominations submitted by President Bush were referred to the Committee during the 107th Congress. Thirty nominations were reported by the Committee and confirmed by the Senate. Two nominations were withdrawn and two were returned to the President pursuant to Rule XXXI, paragraph 6 of the Standing Rules of the Senate.

The Committee filed 127 reports on measures it ordered reported, and published 78 hearing records and one committee print.

JURISDICTION

Rule XXV(1)(g)(1) of the Standing Rules of the Senate gives the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources jurisdiction over matters relating to the following subjects:

1. Coal production, distribution, and utilization.
2. Energy policy.
3. Energy regulation and conservation.
4. Energy related aspects of deepwater ports.
5. Energy research and development.
6. Extraction of minerals from oceans and Outer Continental Shelf lands.
7. Hydroelectric power, irrigation, and reclamation.
8. Mining education and research.
9. Mining, mineral lands, mining claims, and mineral conservation.
10. National parks, recreation areas, wilderness areas, wild and scenic rivers, historical sites, military parks and battlefields, and on the public domain, preservation of prehistoric ruins and objects of interest.
11. Naval petroleum reserves in Alaska.
12. Nonmilitary development of nuclear energy.
13. Oil and gas production and distribution.
14. Public lands and forests, including farming and grazing thereon, and mineral extraction therefrom.
15. Solar energy systems.
16. Territorial possessions of the United States, including trusteeships.

ORGANIZATION

On January 3, 2001, the Senate adopted S. Res. 7, appointing Senator Bingaman Chairman of the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources until noon on January 20, 2001, and appointing Senator Murkowski Chairman beginning at noon on that day. On January 5, 2001, the Senate adopted another resolution, S. Res. 8, which provided that "if at any time during the 107th Congress either party attains a majority of the whole number of Senators, then . . . the committee chairmanships shall be held by the party which has attained a majority of the whole number of Senators." On June 6, 2001, when the Democratic party attained a majority of the whole number of Senators, Senator Bingaman again became Chairman of the Committee pursuant to S. Res. 8 and remained Chairman for the remainder of the 107th Congress.

On March 7, 2001, the Committee appointed four subcommittees: the Subcommittee on Energy Research, Development, Production and Regulation; the Subcommittee on Forests and Public Land Management; the Subcommittee on National Parks, Historic Preservation, and Recreation; and the Subcommittee on Water and Power.

On July 12, 2001, following the appointment of additional members to the Committee on July 10, 2001, the Committee reorganized its subcommittees. The Subcommittee on Energy Research, Development, Production and Regulation was renamed the Subcommittee on Energy; the Subcommittee on Forests and Public Land Management was renamed the Subcommittee on Public

Lands and Forests; and the Subcommittee on National Parks, Historic Preservation, and Recreation was renamed the Subcommittee on National Parks. The Subcommittee on Water and Power retained its original name.

JURISDICTION

JURISDICTION

MAJOR LEGISLATIVE INITIATIVES

Comprehensive Energy Policy Legislation

Both the Senate and the House of Representatives passed comprehensive energy policy legislation dealing with energy conservation and efficiency, energy research and development, energy production and infrastructure, and hydro, fossil, nuclear, and renewable energy resources during the 107th Congress. The principal legislative vehicle was H.R. 4, the Securing America's Future Energy Act of 2001. The Committee of the Whole House on the State of the Union considered H.R. 4 on August 1, 2001, and the House of Representatives passed it on August 2, 2001. H.R. 4 was placed on the Senate Calendar on September 4, 2001 without reference to committee.

Two comprehensive energy bills comparable in scope to H.R. 4 were introduced in the Senate and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources during the 1st Session of the 107th Congress. S. 388, the National Energy Security Act of 2001, was introduced by Senator Murkowski on February 26, 2001; and S. 597, the Comprehensive and Balanced Energy Policy Act of 2001, was introduced by Senator Bingaman on March 22, 2001. In addition, numerous bills dealing with various energy policy issues were referred to the Committee, and were considered by the Committee. These bills included:

- S. 71, the Hydroelectric Licensing Process Improvement Act of 2001;
- S. 90, the Department of Energy Nanoscale Science and Engineering Research Act;
- S. 95, the Federal Energy Bank Act;
- S. 193, the Department of Energy Advanced Scientific Computing Act;
- S. 242, the Department of Energy University Nuclear Science and Engineering Act;
- S. 259, the National Laboratories Partnership Improvement Act of 2001;
- S. 352, the Energy Emergency Response Act of 2001;
- S. 472, the Nuclear Energy Electricity Supply Assurance Act of 2001;
- S. 636, to direct the Secretary of Energy to establish a decommissioning pilot program to decommission and decontaminate the sodium-cooled fast breeder experimental test-site reactor located in northwest Arkansas;
- S. 771, to permanently prohibit the conduct of offshore drilling on the Outer Continental Shelf of the State of Florida, and for other purposes;
- S. 900, the Consumer Energy Commission Act of 2001;
- S. 901, the Coastal States Protection Act;

- S. 933, the Combined Heat and Power Advancement Act of 2001;
- S. 1006, the Renewable Fuels for Energy Security Act of 2001;
- S. 1053, the Hydrogen Future Act of 2001;
- S. 1086, the Clean Ocean and Safe Tourism Anti-Drilling Act;
- S. 1147, to amend title X and title XI of the Energy Policy Act of 1992;
- S. 1166, the Next Generation Lighting Act; and
- S.J. Res. 15, providing for congressional disapproval of the rule submitted by the Department of Energy relating to the postponement of the effective date of energy conservation standards for central air conditioners.

The Committee held hearings on these measures on May 24, June 26, July 12, July 13, July 17, July 18, July 19, July 24, July 15, and July 26, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–144, parts 1–3.

The Committee began marking up comprehensive energy policy legislation on August 1, 2001. On October 9, 2001, Chairman Bingaman, suspended the Committee markup, and, at the request of the Majority Leader, began drafting a new bill. The new bill, S. 1766, was introduced by Senator Daschle and Senator Bingaman on December 5, 2001 and placed on the Senate Calendar the following day.

The Senate began debating comprehensive energy policy legislation on February 15, 2002, when S. 517, the National Laboratories Partnership Improvement Act of 2001, previously reported by the Committee, was laid before the Senate. Senator Daschle offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to the National Laboratories Partnership Improvement Act. Senator Daschle's substitute amendment, Amendment 2917, consisted of the text of the Daschle-Bingaman energy bill, S. 1766, with various modifications.

The Senate debated S. 517 on February 15, March 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 19, 20, and 21, and April 8, 9, 10, 11, 16, 17, 18, 22, 23, 24, and 25, 2002. Over the course of the debate, the Senate agreed to approximately 125 amendments to S. Amendment 2917.

On April 25, 2002, the Senate passed the House energy bill, H.R. 4, after agreeing to the Amendment 2917, as amended, and striking the House-passed text of H.R. 4 and inserting the text of S. 517, as amended by Amendment 2917.

The Senate asked for, and the House agreed to, a conference. The conference met on June 27, July 25, September 12, 19, 25, and 26, and October 2 and 3, but was unable to resolve the differences between the two bodies before the 107th Congress adjourned.

Approval of the Yucca Mountain Site

The Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 set up a multi-step process for approving the use of the Yucca Mountain site in Nevada as a repository for spent fuel from the nation's commercial nuclear power plants and high-level radioactive waste from the nuclear weapons program. First, the Secretary of Energy was to study the site and determine if it is suitable. Second, if the Secretary found the site to be suitable, he was to recommend that the President approve the site for development as a repository. Third, if the President considered the site to be qualified, he was to recommend it to Congress. At that point, the Act authorized the Governor of Nevada

to disapprove the site. The Governor's disapproval would bar development of the repository unless both Houses of Congress passed a joint resolution approving the site within 90 days of continuous session. The Act required the chairman of the Senate committee to which the Governor's notice of disapproval was referred, or his designee, to introduce the joint resolution upon receipt of the notice of disapproval, and prescribed expedited procedures for the consideration of the joint resolution.

On February 14, 2002, the Secretary of Energy recommended the Yucca Mountain site to the President. The following day, the President found the site to be qualified and recommended it to Congress. On April 8, the Governor of Nevada submitted a notice of disapproval. On April 9, Senator Bingaman, as chairman of the committee to which the notice of disapproval was referred, introduced S. J. Res. 34, approving the site.

The Committee held three days of legislative hearings on the joint resolution, receiving testimony from the Secretary of Energy on May 16, 2002, opponents of the resolution on May 22, and Federal regulatory agencies and technical overseers on May 23, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-483. On June 5, 2002, the Committee ordered S.J. Res. 34 favorably reported to the Senate. S. Rept. 107-159.

An identical resolution, H.J. Res. 87, was introduced in the House of Representatives and referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce on April 11, 2002. H.J. Res. 87 was favorably reported from the Committee on Energy and Commerce on May. H. Rept. 107-425. It passed the House on May 9, 2002 and, pursuant to the terms of the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982, was placed on the Senate Calendar.

The Senate debated S.J. Res. 34 on July 9, 2002, and passed H.J. Res. 87 in lieu of S.J. Res. 34 on the same day.

Calfed Bay-Delta Program

The Committee considered major legislation which would have authorized the Calfed Bay-Delta Program, to address water resource management issues in the California Bay-Delta, the region located east of the San Francisco Bay, where the San Joaquin and Sacramento Rivers converge. The stated mission of the Program "is to develop and implement a long-term comprehensive plan that will restore ecological health and improve water management for beneficial uses of the Bay-Delta." The Program, as set forth in a Record of Decision (ROD) issued by the Department of the Interior and the State of California on August 28, 2000, has the following components: water storage; ecosystem restoration; water supply reliability; conveyance; water use efficiency; water quality; water transfers; watersheds; Environmental Water Account; levee stability; governance; and science. The ROD describes the Calfed Bay-Delta Program as one of the most extensive ecosystem restoration efforts ever proposed, the most intensive water conservation effort ever attempted, the most far-reaching effort to improve drinking water quality for Californians, and the most significant investment in water storage and conveyance in California in decades.

Senator Feinstein introduced S. 976, the "California Ecosystem, Water Supply, and Water Quality Enhancement Act of 2001," on May 25, 2001, which would have authorized funding for enhance-

ment of ecosystems, and water supply and water quality, including the Calfed Bay-Delta Program. On July 19, 2001, the Subcommittee on Water and Power conducted a hearing on S. 976. S. Hrg. 107–253. On December 5, 2001, Senator Feinstein introduced S. 1768, the “Calfed Bay-Delta Authorization Act,” legislation providing for the authorization of the first seven years of the Calfed Bay-Delta Program. The bill was considered by the Committee at its business meetings on May 15, and June 5, 2002. The Committee adopted an amendment in the nature of a substitute.

As ordered reported by the Committee on June 5, 2002, S. 1768 would have authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary of the Interior and other Federal agency heads \$1,630,000,000 to implement the Calfed Bay-Delta Program during fiscal years 2003 through 2005. S. Rept. 107–171.

Sandia Mountain Land Claims

S. 2018, the T’uf Shur Bien Preservation Trust Area Act was the focus of a significant amount of Committee work during the 107th Congress. Senators Bingaman and Domenici introduced the bill to resolve Sandia Pueblo’s claim of ownership to Sandia Mountain in New Mexico. The Mountain is within the Cibola National Forest and includes a substantial portion of the Sandia Mountain Wilderness. Settlement of the claim was made possible through the development of a negotiated agreement that includes: (1) the establishment of the T’uf Shur Bien Preservation Trust Area with specific rights and interests for the Pueblo; (2) maintaining public ownership and access to the National Forest and Wilderness lands within the Area; and (3) clearing title and granting necessary rights of way for homeowners and other affected parties within the Area.

The Committee on Energy and Natural Resources and the Committee on Indian Affairs held a joint hearing on S. 2018 on April 24, 2002. S. Hrg. 107–548. The Committee on Energy and Natural Resources ordered the bill reported with an amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107–285. The Committee on Indian Affairs reported the bill with a further amendment on October 17, 2002. S. Rept. 107–321. The text of S. 2018, as amended, was incorporated in Amendment 4978 to S. 2556. The Senate agreed to Amendment 4978 and passed S. 2556, as amended, on November 19, 2002.

Community-Based Forest and Public Lands Restoration

S. 2672, the Community-Based Forest and Public Lands Restoration Act, also received considerable attention from the Committee. Recognizing the principle that there is an inextricable link between the sustainability of natural resource-based communities and the sustainability of forests, S. 2672 supports community-driven efforts to integrate economic development with environmental protection and management. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on July 25, 2002. S. Hrg. 107–838. The Committee ordered S. 2672 reported with an amendment on October 3, 2002. The text of S. 2672, as amended, was incorporated in Amendment 4976 to S. 2672. The Senate agreed to Amendment 4976 and passed S. 2672, as amended, on November 19, 2002.

MEASURES ENACTED INTO LAW

Public Law 107–11 (H.R. 1696; Mr. Stump et al.): An Act to expedite the construction of the World War II memorial in the District of Columbia. The Senate discharged the Committee and passed H.R. 1696 with an amendment on May 21, 2001. The House agreed to the Senate amendment on May 22, 2001, and the President approved the measure on May 28, 2001.

Public Law 107–28 (H.R. 271; Mr. Gibbons): An Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey a former Bureau of Land Management administrative site to the city of Carson City, Nevada, for use as a senior center. The Committee ordered the Senate companion measure, S. 230, reported without amendment on May 16, 2001. S. Rept. 107–21. The Senate passed H.R. 271 in lieu of S. 230 on August 3, 2001, and the President approved it on August 20, 2001.

Public Law 107–30 (H.R. 427; Mr. Blumenauer et al.): An Act to provide further protections for the watershed of the Little Sandy River as part of the Bull Run Watershed Management Unit, Oregon, and for other purposes. The Committee ordered the Senate companion measure, S. 254, reported without amendment on May 16, 2001. S. Rept. 107–23. The Senate passed H.R. 427 in lieu of S. 254 on August 3, 2001, and the President approved it on August 20, 2001.

Public Law 107–59 (H.R. 146; Mr. Pascrell): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Great Falls Historic District in Paterson, New Jersey, as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 146 on July 17, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–219. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on August 2, 2001. S. Rept. 107–74. The Senate passed the bill without amendment on October 17, 2001 and the President approved it on November 5, 2001.

Public Law 107–60 (H.R. 1000; Mr. Portman et al.): An Act to adjust the boundary of the William Howard Taft National Historic Site in the State of Ohio, to authorize an exchange of land in connection with the historic site, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 1000 and the Senate companion bill, S. 921, on July 17, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–219. The Committee ordered H.R. 1000 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 921 on August 2, 2001. S. Rept. 107–76. The Senate passed H.R. 1000 on October 17, 2001 and the President approved it on November 5, 2001.

Public Law 107–62 (H.R. 1668; Mr. Roemer et al.): An Act to authorize the Adams Memorial Foundation to establish a commemorative work on Federal land in the District of Columbia and its environs to honor former President John Adams and his legacy. The Subcommittee held a hearing on H.R. 1668 on July 17, 2001. S.

Hrg. 107-219. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on August 2, 2001. S. Rept. 107-77. The Senate passed the bill on October 17, 2001 and the President approved it on November 5, 2001.

Public Law 107-65 (H.R. 182; Mr. Simmons et al.): An Act to amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate a segment of the Eightmile River in the State of Connecticut for study for potential addition to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 182 and the Senate companion measure, S. 513, on July 17, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-219. The Committee ordered H.R. 182 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 513 on August 2, 2001. S. Rept. 107-75. The Senate passed H.R. 182 on October 17, 2001, and the President approved it on November 6, 2001.

Public Law 107-69 (H.R. 2925; Mr. Calvert): An Act to amend the Reclamation Recreation Management Act of 1992 in order to provide for the security of dams, facilities, and resources under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Reclamation. The Subcommittee on Water and Power held a hearing on the Senate companion measure, S. 1480, on October 9, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-335. H.R. 2925 was passed by the House on October 23, 2002, received in the Senate on October 24, 2001, and held at the desk. The Senate passed H.R. 2935 on October 30, 2001, and the President approved it on November 12, 2001.

Public Law 107-78 (H.R. 2924; Mr. Calvert): An Act to provide authority to the Federal Power Marketing Administrations to reduce vandalism and destruction of property, and for other purposes. H.R. 2924 was received in the Senate on October 24, 2001 and was held at the desk. The Senate passed the bill on November 15, 2001, and the President approved it on November 28, 2001.

Public Law 107-137 (H.R. 400; Mr. Hastert et al.): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish the Ronald Reagan Boyhood Home National Historic Site, and for other purposes. H.R. 400 was received in the Senate on November 14, 2001 and was placed on the Calendar without reference to the Committee. The Senate passed the bill on January 29, 2002, and the President approved it on February 6, 2002.

Public Law 107-200 (H.J. Res. 87; Mr. Barton et al.): Approving the site at Yucca Mountain, Nevada, for the development of a repository for the disposal of high-level radioactive waste and spent nuclear fuel, pursuant to the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982. See Major Legislative Initiatives: Approval of the Yucca Mountain Site.

Public Law 107-203 (H.R. 3971; Mr. Hastings et al.): An Act to provide for an independent investigation of Forest Service firefighter deaths that are caused by wildfire entrapment or burnover. H.R. 3971 was received in the Senate on June 25, 2002 and placed on the Calendar without reference to the Committee. The Senate passed H.R. 3971 on July 10, 2002, and the President approved it on July 24, 2002.

Public Law 107-211 (H.R. 223; Mr. Udall): An Act to amend the Clear Creek County, Colorado, Public Lands Transfer Act of 1993 to provide additional time for Clear Creek County to dispose of certain lands transferred to the county under the Act. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on H.R. 223

on November 27, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-373. The Committee ordered H.R. 223 reported without amendment on June 28, 2002. S. Rept. 107-198. The Senate passed H.R. 223 on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-212 (H.R. 309; Mr. Underwood): An Act to provide for the determination of withholding tax rates under the Guam income tax. The Committee held a hearing on H.R. 309 on July 27, 2001, S. Hrg. 107-199, and ordered it reported without amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-173. The Senate passed the bill August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-213 (H.R. 601; Mr. Simpson et al.): An Act to redesignate certain lands within the Craters of the Moon National Monument, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 601 on July 31, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-231. The Committee ordered it reported without amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-181. The Senate passed the bill on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-214 (H.R. 1384; Mr. Udall et al.): An Act to amend the National Trails System Act to designate the route in Arizona and New Mexico which the Navajo and Mescalero Apache Indian Tribes were forced to walk in 1863 and for study for potential addition to the National Trails System. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 1384 on March 7, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-522. The Committee ordered it reported without amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-184. The Senate passed the bill on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-215 (H.R. 1456; Mr. Goode): An Act to expand the boundary of the Booker T. Washington National Monument, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 1456 and the Senate companion bill, S. 1051, on February 14, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-453. The Committee ordered H.R. 1456 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 1051 on June 28, 2002. S. Rept. 107-199. The Senate passed H.R. 1456 on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-216 (H.R. 1576; Mr. Udall): An Act to designate the James Peak Wilderness and Protection Area in the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests in the State of Colorado, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on H.R. 1576 and its Senate companion measure, S. 1711, on May 9, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-754. The Committee ordered H.R. 1576 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 1711 on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-200. The Senate passed H.R. 1576 on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-218 (H.R. 2234; Mr. Pastor): An Act to revise the boundary of the Tumacacori National Historical Park in the State of Arizona. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 2234 on February 14, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-453. The Committee ordered it reported without amendment on June 27, 2002. S. Rept. 107-185. The Senate passed the bill on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107-219 (H.R. 2440; Mr. Davis et al.): An Act to rename Wolf Trap Farm Park as "Wolf Trap National Park for the Performing Arts", and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on

National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 2440 and the Senate companion bill, S. 202, on February 14, 2002. S. Hrg. 107–453. The Committee ordered H.R. 2440 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 202 on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107–182. The Senate passed the H.R. 2440 on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107–221 (H.R. 2643; Mr. Wu et al.): An Act to authorize the acquisition of additional lands for inclusion in the Fort Clatsop National Memorial in the State of Oregon, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on the Senate companion measure, S. 423, on July 26, 2001. The Committee ordered S. 423 reported with amendments on October 1, 2001. S. Rept. 107–69. The Senate agreed to the committee amendments and passed S. 423, as amended, on October 17, 2001. The House passed H.R. 2643 in lieu of S. 423 on July 8, 2002. The Senate placed H.R. 2643 on the Calendar without reference to the Committee on July 9, 2002. The Senate passed it on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107–222 (H.R. 3343; Mr. Shimkus et al.): An Act to amend title X of the Energy Policy Act of 1992, and for other purposes. The Committee held a hearing on the Senate companion measure, S. 1147, on July 12, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–144, part 1, app. H.R. 3343 was received in the Senate on December 19, 2001 and was placed on the Calendar without reference to the Committee. The Senate passed H.R. 3343 without amendment on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002.

Public Law 107–223 (H.R. 3380; Mr. Jenkins): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to issue right-of-way permits for natural gas pipelines within the boundary of Great Smoky Mountains National Park. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on the Senate companion bill, S. 1097, on July 17, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–219. The Committee ordered S. 1097 reported without amendment on August 2, 2001. S. Rept. 107–72. The Senate agreed to an amendment, No. 1903, and passed S. 1097, as amended, on October 17, 2001. The House passed H.R. 3380 in lieu of S. 1097 on July 8, 2002. The Senate placed H.R. 3380 on the Calendar without reference to the Committee. The Senate passed H.R. 3380 on August 1, 2002, and the President approved it on August 21, 2002. See Public Law 107–223.

Public Law 107–226 (H.R. 3917; Mr. Murtha et al.): An act to authorize a national memorial to commemorate the passengers and crew of Flight 93 who, on September 11, 2001, courageously gave their lives thereby thwarting a planned attack on our Nation's Capital, and for other purposes. The Senate discharged the Committee from consideration of H.R. 3917 and the Senate companion measure, S. 2136, and passed H.R. 3917 on September 10, 2002. The President signed H.R. 3917 into law on September 24, 2002.

Public Law 107–236 (H.R. 640; Mr. Gallegly et al.): An Act to adjust the boundaries of Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 640 on July 26, 2001. S. Hrg. 107–204. The Committee ordered it reported with an amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107–204. The Senate agreed to the committee amendment and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1,

2002. The House agreed to the Senate amendment on September 24, 2002, and the President approved the measure on October 9, 2002.

Public Law 107-237 (S. 238; Mr. Wyden and Mr. Smith of Oregon): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct feasibility studies on water optimization in the Burnt River basin, Malheur River basin, Owyhee River basin, and Powder River basin, Oregon. The Committee ordered S. 238 reported without amendment on June 5, 2001. S. Rept. 107-22. The Senate passed the bill on August 3, 2001; the House passed it on September 24, 2002; and the President approved it on October 11, 2002.

Public Law 107-238 (S. 1175; Mr. Lott and Mr. Cochran): An Act to modify the boundary of Vicksburg National Military Park to include the property known as Pemberton's Headquarters, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held hearing on S. 1175 on July 31, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-231. The Committee ordered the bill reported with an amendment on June 27, 2002. S. Rept. 107-183. The Senate agreed to the committee amendment and passed the bill, as amended, on July 24, 2002. The House passed the bill on September 24, 2002, and the President approved it on October 11, 2002.

Public Law 107-239 (S. 1325; Mr. Murkowski): An Act to ratify an agreement between the Aleut Corporation and the United States of America to exchange land rights received under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act for certain land interests on Adak Island, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on May 9, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-754. The Committee ordered the bill reported with an amendment on June 26, 2002. S. Rept. 107-180. The Senate agreed to the committee amendment and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1, 2002. The House passed it on September 24, 2002, and the President approved it on October 11, 2002.

Public Law 107-256 (S. 1227; Mr. Schumer and Mrs. Clinton): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the suitability and feasibility of establishing the Niagara Falls National Heritage Area in the State of New York, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on July 31, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-231. The Committee ordered it reported with amendments on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-179. The Senate agreed to the committee amendments and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1, 2002. The House passed it on October 16, 2002, and the President approved it on October 29, 2002.

Public Law 107-282 (H.R. 5200; Mr. Gibbons): An Act to establish wilderness areas, promote conservation, improve public land, and provide for high quality development in Clark County, Nevada, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on the Senate companion measure, S. 2612, on June 30, 2002. The Committee ordered S. 2612 reported with an amendment on October 3, 2002. The House passed H.R. 5200 on October 16, 2002. The Senate passed H.R. 5200 in lieu of S. 2612 on October 17, 2002, and the President approved it on November 6, 2002.

Public Law 107-315 (H.J.Res. 117; Mr. Roemer et al.): An Act to approve the location of the commemorative work in the District of

The Committee ordered S. 1010 reported without amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-192. The Senate passed it on August 1, 2002; the House passed it on November 15, 2002; and the President approved it on December 4, 2002.

Public Law 107-324 (S. 1907; Mr. Smith and Mr. Wyden): An Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain land to the city of Haines, Oregon. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on S. 1907 on May 9, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-754. The Committee ordered S. 1907 reported with an amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-197. The Senate agreed to the committee amendment and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1, 2002. The House passed it on November 14, 2002, and the President approved it on December 4, 2002.

Public Law 107-325 (S. 1946; Mr. Lott, Mr. Campbell, Mr. Domenici, Mr. Bingaman and Mr. Allard): An Act to amend the National Trails Systems Act to designate the Old Spanish Trail as a National Historic Trail. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on S. 1946 on March 7, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-522. The Committee ordered it reported with amendments on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-203. The Senate agreed to the committee amendments and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1, 2002. The House passed it on November 14, 2002, and the President signed it into law on December 4, 2002.

Public Law 107-329 (S. 1240; Mr. Bennett): An Act to provide for the acquisition of land and construction of an interagency administrative and visitor facility at the entrance to American Fork Canyon, Utah, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on S. 1240 on November 27, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-373. The Committee ordered it reported with an amendment on June 5, 2002. S. Rept. 107-178. The Senate agreed to the committee amendment and passed the bill, as amended, on August 1, 2002. The House passed it on September 24, 2002, and the President signed it into law on December 6, 2002.

Public Law 107-332 (H.R. 38; Bereuter): An Act to provide for additional lands to be included within the boundaries of the Homestead National Monument of America in the State of Nebraska, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on June 12, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-722. The Committee ordered the bill reported without an amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107-260. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 16, 2002.

Public Law 107-333 (H.R. 308; Mr. Underwood et al.): An Act to establish the Guam War Claims Review Commission. The Committee held a hearing on July 27, 2001. S. Hrg. 107-199. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on June 5,

Public Law 107–336 (H.R. 1712; Mr. Faleomavaega): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to make adjustments to the boundary of the National Park of the American Samoa to include certain portions of the islands of Ofu and Olosega within the park, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on June 12, 2002. S. Hrg. 107–722. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107–270. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 16, 2002.

Public Law 107–338 (H.R. 1814; Mr. Olver): An Act to amend the National Trails System Act to designate the Metacomet-Monadnock-Sunapee-Mattabesett Trail extending through western New Hampshire, western Massachusetts, and central Connecticut for study for potential addition to the National Trails System. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 1814 on June 20, 2002. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107–263. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 16, 2002.

Public Law 107–340 (H.R. 1906; Mrs. Mink et al.): An Act to amend the Act that established the Pu‘uhonua O Honaunau Na-

tional Historical Park to expand the boundaries of that park. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107-272. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 16, 2002.

Public Law 107-341 (H.R. 1925; Mr. Edwards): An Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Waco Mammoth Site Area in Waco, Texas, as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 1925 on July 18, 2002. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107-264. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 16, 2002.

Public Law 107-342 (H.R. 2099; Mr. Baird et al.): An Act to amend the Omnibus Parks and Public Lands Management Act of 1966 to provide adequate funding authorization for the Vancouver National Historic Reserve. The Subcommittee held a hearing on H.R. 2109 and the Senate companion bill, S. 1312, on June 12, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-722. The Committee ordered H.R. 2109 reported without amendment on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107-273. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-344 (H.R. 2115; Mr. Smith): An Act to amend the Reclamation Wastewater and Groundwater Study and Facilities Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to participate in the design, planning, and construction of a project to reclaim and reuse wastewater within and outside of the service area of the Lakehaven Utility District, Washington. The Subcommittee on Water and Power held a hearing on H.R. 2115 and the Senate companion measure, S. 1385, on June 6, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-817. The Committee ordered H.R. 2115 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 1385 on July 31, 2002. The Senate passed H.R. 2115 on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-346 (H.R. 2385; Mr. Hansen): An Act to convey certain property to the city of St. George, Utah, in order to provide for the protection and preservation of certain rare paleontological resources on that property, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Forests held a hearing on May 9, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-754. The Committee ordered the bill reported with amendments on July 31, 2002. S. Rept. 107-274. The Senate agreed to the withdrawal of the committee amendments and passed

The Committee ordered H.R. 2990 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 1577 on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed H.R. 2990 without amendment on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-353 (H.R. 3401; Mr. Radanovich): An Act to provide for the conveyance of Forest Service facilities and lands comprising the Five Mile Regional Learning Center in the State of California to the Clovis Unified School District, to authorize a new special use permit regarding the continued use of un conveyed lands comprising the Center, and for other purposes. Public Law 107-356 (H.R. 3858; Mr. Rahall): An Act to modify the boundaries of the New River Gorge National River, West Virginia. The Subcommittee held a hearing on September 19, 2002. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-357 (H.R. 4692; Mr. Bishop): An Act to amend and Act entitled "An Act to authorize the Establishment of the Andersonville National Historic Site in the State of Georgia, and for other purposes", to provide for the addition of certain donated lands to the Andersonville National Historic Site. The House passed H.R. 4692 on October 1, 2002; the Senate passed it on November 19, 2002; and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-359 (H.R. 5125; Mr. Miller et al.): An Act to amend the American Battlefield Protection Act of 1996 to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish a battlefield acquisition grant program. Public Law 107-361 (H.R. 2818; Mr. Simpson): An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain public land within the Sand Mountain Wilderness Study Area in the State of Idaho to resolve an occupancy encroachment dating back to 1971. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 17, 2002.

Public Law 107-362 (H.R. 3048; Mr. Young): An Act to resolve the claims of Cook Inlet Region, Inc., to lands adjacent to the Russian River in the State of Alaska. The Committee held a hearing on the Senate companion measure, S. 1879, on June 18, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-762. The Committee ordered H.R. 3048 reported without amendment in lieu of S. 1879 on July 31, 2002. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-363 (H.R. 3747; Mr. Inslee et al.): An Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the site commonly known as Eagledale Ferry Dock at Taylor Avenue in the State of Washington for potential inclusion in the National Park System. The House passed H.R. 3747 on November 15, 2002; the Senate passed it in lieu of S. 1959 on November 19, 2002; and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-364 (H.R. 3909; Mr. Hansen): An Act to designate certain Federal lands in the State of Utah as the Gunn McKay Nature Preserve, and for other purposes. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on October 3, 2002.

The Senate passed it without amendment on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-365 (H.R. 3954; Mr. Acevedo-Villa et al.): An Act to designate certain waterways in the Caribbean National Forest in the Commonwealth and Puerto Rico as components of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee on National Parks held a hearing on H.R. 3954 on July 23, 2002. S. Hrg. 107-794. The Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-366 (H.R. 4129; Mr. Cannon): An Act to amend the Central Utah Project Completion Act to clarify the responsibilities of the Secretary of the Interior with respect to the Central Utah Project, to redirect unexpended budget authority for the Central Utah Project for wastewater treatment and reuse and other purposes, to provide for prepayment of repayment contracts for municipal and industrial water delivery facilities, and to eliminate a deadline for such prepayment. The Committee ordered S. 2623 reported with an amendment on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed H.R. 4944 in lieu of S. 2623 on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-374 (H.R. 4953; Mr. Walden): An Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to grant to Deschutes and Crook Counties in the State of Oregon a right-of-way to West Butte Road. To Committee ordered the bill reported without amendment on October 3, 2002. The Senate passed the bill on November 19, 2002, and the President approved it on December 19, 2002.

Public Law 107-376 (H.R. 5436; Mr. DeFazio): An Act to extend the deadline for commencement of construction of a hydroelectric project in the State of Oregon. The Committee ordered the Senate companion bill, S. 2927, reported without amendment on October 3, 2002.
